PERMIT ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT**

A. A county shall not base a licensing decision in whole or in part on a licensing requirement or condition that is not specifically authorized by statute, rule, ordinance or delegation agreement. A general grant of authority does not constitute a basis for imposing a licensing requirement or condition unless the authority specifically authorizes the requirement or condition.

B. Unless specifically authorized, a county shall avoid duplication of other laws that do not enhance regulatory clarity and shall avoid dual permitting to the maximum extent practicable.

C. This section does not prohibit county flexibility to issue licenses or adopt ordinances or codes.

D. A county shall not request or initiate discussions with a person about waiving that person's rights.

E. This section may be enforced in a private civil action and relief may be awarded against a county. The court may award reasonable attorney fees, damages and all fees associated with the license application to a party that prevails in an action against a county for a violation of this section.

F. A county employee may not intentionally or knowingly violate this section. A violation of this section is cause for disciplinary action or dismissal pursuant to the county's adopted personnel policy.

G. This section does not abrogate the immunity provided by section 12-820.01 or 12-820.02.

Pursuant to § A.R.S. 41-1080, individuals wanting to obtain a permit or license in Arizona must show proof of lawful presence in the United States. To become eligible for a permit, complete this form, **staple a photocopy showing both sides of your identification to the back** and return with the application for permit or application for renewal.

Only provide **one** of the following forms of identification:

1. An Arizona driver license issued after 1996 or an Arizona non-operating identification license;
2. A driver’s license issued by a state that verifies lawful presence in the United States;
3. A birth certificate or delayed birth certificate issued in any state, territory or possession of the United States;
4. A United States certificate of birth abroad;
5. A United States passport;
6. A foreign passport with a United States visa;
7. An I-94 form with a photograph;
8. A United States citizenship and immigration services employment authorization document or refugee travel document;
9. A United States certificate of naturalization;
10. A United States certificate of citizenship;
11. A tribal certificate of Indian blood;
12. A tribal or bureau of Indian affairs affidavit of birth; or,
13. A license issued by the federal government, a state government, and Arizona agency or Arizona political subdivision that required proof of citizenship or lawful alien status.
