The Yuma County Local Emergency Planning Committee provides a forum for emergency management, first responders, community industries and citizens to engage and provide information about chemicals and potential risks in the community, develop emergency plans in the event of an accidental release and look at ways to prevent chemical accidents.

EPCRA Sections 311-312, requires local industry representatives to report hazardous chemicals used, transporting, or stored in their workplace or facilities, and maintain an MSDS. Inventory reports of these chemicals must be submitted to their State Emergency Response Commission (SERC), Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) and local fire department, by March 1st of every year. This information will be made available to the public.
