
A RESOLUTION OF THE COCOPAH INDIAN TRIBE TO ADOPT

AND THE TRIBAL ANNEX FOR THE COCOPAH INDIAN TRIBE


- WHEREAS:** The Cocopah Indian Tribe is a federally recognized Tribe organized Pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1943 (25 U.S.C. 476), as amended by the act of June 15<sup>th</sup>, 1935 (49 Stat.378); and,
- WHEREAS:** The Cocopah Tribal Council is the legal governing body of the Cocopah Tribe, empowered by Article V and VI of the Constitution and Bylaws of the Cocopah Tribe; and,
- WHEREAS:** The Cocopah Tribal Council pursuant to its sovereign powers that is committed to protecting the life, health, safety, property, wellbeing, and environmental quality of its residents and employees hereby adopts the Yuma County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan 2019 and the Tribal Annex for the Cocopah Indian Tribe; and,
- WHEREAS:** The Cocopah Indian Tribe participated in the preparation of the Yuma County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan 2019 and the Tribal Annex for the Cocopah Indian Tribe; and,
- WHEREAS:** The Cocopah Indian Tribe afforded tribal members opportunity to comment and provide input to the Plan; and,
- WHEREAS:** The Cocopah Indian Tribe has reviewed the Plan and affirms that the Plan will be updated no less than every five years; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** The Cocopah Tribal Council hereby adopts the Yuma County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan 2019 and the Tribal Annex for the Cocopah Indian Tribe as this tribes Multi-Hazard Mitigation plan, and resolves to execute the actions in the plan.

**RESOLUTION NO. R2019-035**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF YUMA, ARIZONA, SUPPORTING THE YUMA COUNTY MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN - MARCH 2019**

WHEREAS, the City of Yuma has historically experienced natural and human caused hazards resulting in significant property damage, loss of life, economic hardship, and threats to public health and safety; and,

WHEREAS, Section 104 of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (DMA 2000) Public Law 106-390 enacted October 30, 2000 requires States, Tribes, and local governments to develop an approved mitigation plan as a condition to seek and receive Federal monies for hazard mitigation measures and requires that existing plans be updated every five (5) years, with each plan cycle requiring a complete review, revision, and re-approval of the plan at both the state level and Federal level; and,

WHEREAS, members of the City of Yuma Fire, Police and Community Development Departments, working with the Yuma County Multi-Jurisdictional Planning Team completed the required five (5) year update of the Yuma County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan used to identify potential risks to our region, critical infrastructure, costs to repair and/or projects to reduce risk to that infrastructure; and,

WHEREAS, said Plan has been approved by the State of Arizona Division of Emergency Management (ADEM) and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and returned for adoption by Resolutions of Support by Yuma County and incorporated communities within Yuma County.


NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Yuma as follows:


SECTION 2: Resolution R2011-30 supporting the Yuma County Multi-Jurisdiction Hazard Mitigation Plan 2010 is repealed.
