Yuma County Public Health District Update

Yuma County Health Officials confirm 152 new cases of COVID-19 and 2 new deaths, bringing the total cases to 4,756, and total deaths to 67. Health officials are conducting contact investigations.

NOTE: Moving forward, all new cases of COVID-19 will include positive cases from Yuma County Correctional Facilities and "Testing Blitz" locations.


- Arizona currently has 54,586 confirmed cases of COVID-19, resulting in 1,342 deaths
- Yuma County currently has 4,756 confirmed cases of COVID-19, resulting in 67 deaths
- Currently 28,679 Yuma County residents have been tested
- Currently 119 Yuma County Residents are hospitalized AS OF 8 am 06/18/20; *please note the hospitalization numbers offer an accurate "snapshot" at the time of our daily update, but numbers may fluctuate throughout the day*




Cumulative Tests in Yuma County




Cumulative Cases in Yuma County




COVID-19 Deaths by Day in Yuma County




Cumulative COVID-19 Deaths in Yuma County

Regional Center for Border Health, Inc./San Luis Walk-In Clinic, Inc. (928) 315-7910 is providing screenings every day at the following locations:

Antibody Testing is offered to Businesses and Employers on site, call this number (928) 315-7910 to set up appointment

Regional Center for Border Health, Inc./San Luis Walk-In Clinic, Inc. may provide testing results to employers with patient consent. Testing results may be available within 3-5 days.

A patient portal is available for all clients to obtain their tests results by providing an email account or otherwise they are provided via phone by a Medical Staff member at the clinic.

All insurances are accepted, we do not deny anyone based on the ability to pay.

Sunset Health (928) 819-8999 -- All Sunset Health locations have Monday – Friday Provider appointments available to determine if COVID-19 testing is indicated. Sunset Health is required to complete the testing consistent with the patient’s insurance coverage. The screening and specimen collection will be done by the Sunset Provider. Question of the Day: How can I continue to protect myself from COVID-19 throughout the pandemic? (Source: John Hopkins Medicine)

Until a safe, effective coronavirus vaccine is available, there will continue to be a risk of infection, even as people get back to work, school and a more normal life.

Continue to practice protective measures listed below to protect you and your family:

- [Social and physical distancing](#). Staying at least 6 feet away from anyone not living in your household can help you prevent infection.
- [Handwashing](#). Washing your hands for at least 20 seconds frequently throughout the day, or using hand sanitizer, is an effective way to avoid getting sick with the coronavirus or other germs.
- Wearing a [face mask](#) protects others from illness if you're carrying the virus and don't know it.
- Practice [safe grocery shopping and food handling](#).
- Continue to [practice mindfulness and stress relief](#), as you did during stay-at-

home orders. Mental and emotional well-being is a key aspect of health.

Staying informed about coronavirus can also help you:

- Know what to do if [you think you have the coronavirus](#): whom to call, where to go.
- Understand what to expect [if you're diagnosed with COVID-19](#).
- Look out for signs of the [coronavirus in babies and kids](#). Although the majority of children who contract COVID-19 have mild symptoms, a small percentage of patients under age 18 have experienced severe disease, including a [rare inflammatory condition](#).
- Understand [who's more at risk](#). Older people and those living with heart disease, diabetes and other chronic illnesses have a greater chance of dying from COVID-19.

Yuma County health officials confirm “community spread” of COVID-19 throughout Yuma County. We encourage all residents to take the necessary precautions including physical distancing and staying home if you are sick. Remember to:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for 20 seconds.
- Avoid touching your face, especially your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Avoid people who are sick, and avoid groups of 10 people or more.
- Clean and disinfect frequently-touched surfaces like light switches, door knobs, electronic devices, etc.
- Stay home if you are sick so you do not expose others.
- Practice physical distancing, staying 6 feet away from others.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a cloth face cover when around others.

CITY OF YUMA

City of Yuma facilities will be closed to the general public through at least June 22. The City Council meeting on Wednesday, June 17 will be conducted remotely through technological means along with limited public, in-person access, consistent with social distancing requirements.

Crane Elementary School District Meal Program

Taking a two-week recess from curbside meal service and food box distribution starting on June 8th – June 19th. The meal programs at Salida del Sol/Rancho Viejo and Mesquite Elementary Schools have been closed since June 5th. Since the school closures, Crane School District has provided over 440,000 meals to the community, and provided \$150,000 in milk and produce through the Farmers to Families Program.

YUMA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Everyone's health and safety is important to the Yuma International Airport team. Therefore we have placed hot buttons in the upper left corner on [Yuma International Airport website](#), with COVID information specific to air travel and COVID updates from Yuma County.

Brewers Restaurant & Sports Bar at the airport is open from 11:00 am to 9:00 pm for dine-in seating (seating in accordance with CDC guidance), pick up, curbside pick-up and deliveries from their airport location East to 9E

Beginning May 11th, American Airlines will require passengers to wear face masks while on the aircraft.

Marine Corps Air Station Yuma

Effective April 6, 2020 and until further notice the Trusted Traveler Program is cancelled. This is an additional safety measure that #MCASYuma is taking in order to help stop the spread of #COVID19.

What this means is that essential personnel that do not have common access card (CAC) and Department of Defense (DOD) identification cards are not authorized to come aboard the base without going to the Pass and Registration office and obtaining a base access pass. Essential personnel may obtain base access by providing the appropriate paperwork to the Pass and Registration Office during working hours.

ALL VISITORS will be required to provide justification for needing access to the installation and will not be granted access to the base simply because they know someone that has a CAC or DOD identification card who will be sponsoring/escorting them aboard the base.

As of April 6, 2020, sponsoring a visitor aboard MCAS Yuma that does not have a CAC or DOD identification card is strictly prohibited unless approved at the Pass and Registration Office.

YUMA PROVING GROUND

Although certain access restrictions directed by the Department of the Army are in place, Yuma Proving Ground's essential test mission in support of Army modernization priorities continues. Access to Yuma Proving Ground is currently restricted to the following:

- *YPG residents, including Travel Camp residents
- * YPG employees
- * Civilian contractors who work at YPG
- * Other personnel who come to YPG for an authorized purpose (including personnel on official orders to YPG, DoD retirees/ID card holders, and delivery drivers)
