Yuma County Public Health District Update

Yuma County Health Officials confirm 31 new cases of COVID-19 and 2 new deaths, bringing the total cases to 13,120, and total deaths to 351. Health officials are conducting contact investigations.

NOTE: All new cases of COVID-19 will include any positive cases from Yuma County Correctional Facilities and “Testing Blitz” locations.




- Arizona currently has 229,486 confirmed cases of COVID-19, resulting in 5,806 deaths
- Yuma County currently has 13,120 confirmed cases of COVID-19, resulting in 351 deaths
- Currently 76,399 Yuma County residents have been tested
- Currently 21 Yuma County Residents are hospitalized AS OF 8 am 10/16/20; *please note the hospitalization numbers offer an accurate “snapshot” at the time of our daily update, but numbers may fluctuate throughout the day*

Question of the Day: How many people, visitors and staff, can be in and around a public pool, hot tub, or water playground (such as at an apartment complex or owned by a community) at the same time? (Source: Centers for Disease Control and Prevention)

- The design of the public pool, hot tub, or water playground and surrounding deck and if visitors live together or not will affect how many people can [stay at least 6 feet apart](#) from those they don't live with.
- CDC recommends operators of public pools, hot tubs, and water playgrounds:
 - Comply with local, state, territorial, federal, and tribal regulatory agency policies and requirements on gathering (so the number of swimmers in the water isn't more than the maximum allowed) and
 - Teach and reinforce [social \(physical\) distancing](#) among visitors and staff.
- Operators might want to limit the number of people in and around the water so if the water needs to be evacuated (because of lightning or other health or safety threat) social distancing can be maintained on the deck. Otherwise, if the water is evacuated and social distancing cannot be maintained on the deck, close the deck to visitors. There is no standard formula to determine how many people can maintain social distancing in the water and on the surrounding deck.

- Children 5 years of age or older can be tested during this event. Your child will need their own email address and will need to use a phone number that will not be linked to another adult trying to create an account.
- Face masks must be worn by all people in the car, except children under 2 years old, without exception. Car windows must remain rolled up during the testing process. The window can be lowered halfway while speaking with volunteers.

HOW can YOU get a flu shot in Yuma County?

The 2020-2021 Seasonal Influenza Vaccine is now available at the Health District, 2200 W. 28th Street in Yuma. Seasonal flu vaccinations are available for all individuals 6 months of age and older. The cost is \$25.00 for adults and \$10.00 for youth 18 years and younger. Medicare Part B, AHCCCS and Private Insurance are accepted upon presentation of card.

Yuma County health officials confirm “moderate spread” of COVID-19 throughout Yuma County. We encourage all residents to take the necessary precautions including physical distancing and staying home if you are sick. Remember to:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for 20 seconds.
- Avoid touching your face, especially your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Avoid people who are sick, and avoid groups of 10 people or more.
- Clean and disinfect frequently-touched surfaces like light switches, door knobs, electronic devices, etc.
- Stay home if you are sick so you do not expose others.

- Practice physical distancing, staying 6 feet away from others.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a cloth face cover when around others.

YUMA COUNTY

Yuma County Administrator Susan Thorpe announced that County government offices opened to the public to conduct business beginning Monday, October 5th, under the County's reopening plan.

Yuma County Government Offices PUBLIC visitation hours:

Effective Monday, October 5th, County offices will be open to the public on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

County libraries will begin limited reopening to minimize exposure to COVID-19:

- The Main Library, San Luis, Somerton and Foothills Libraries will have metered access based on size and staffing, with a limit on the number of people in the library at one time.
- Heritage, Dateland, Wellton and Roll Libraries will be by appointment only, due to their smaller staffing.

197 S. Main Street location ONLY:

Beginning on WEDNESDAY, October 7th this County building is open each weekday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. This is the ONLY County building where you can cast an Early Ballot in person. You can also deposit your completed mail ballot in the secure drop box located just outside the front door of this building.

CITY OF YUMA

City Hall is open to the public 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays. (No Friday hours have yet been announced at this time.)

Facial coverings are required of all visitors as well as city employees. Visitors should also observe social distance from others.

Marine Corps Air Station Yuma

Effective April 6, 2020 and until further notice the Trusted Traveler Program is cancelled. This is an additional safety measure that #MCASYuma is taking in order to help stop the spread of #COVID19.

What this means is that essential personnel that do not have common access card (CAC) and Department of Defense (DOD) identification cards are not authorized to come aboard the base without going to the Pass and Registration office and obtaining a base access pass. Essential personnel may obtain base access by providing the appropriate paperwork to the Pass and Registration Office during working hours.

ALL VISITORS will be required to provide justification for needing access to the installation and will not be granted access to the base simply because they know someone that has a CAC or DOD identification card who will be sponsoring/escorting them aboard the base.

As of April 6, 2020, sponsoring a visitor aboard MCAS Yuma that does not have a CAC or DOD identification card is strictly prohibited unless approved at the Pass and Registration Office.

YUMA PROVING GROUND

Although certain access restrictions directed by the Department of the Army are in place, Yuma Proving Ground's essential test mission in support of Army modernization priorities continues. Access to Yuma Proving Ground is currently restricted to the following:

*YPG residents, including Travel Camp residents

- * YPG employees
- * Civilian contractors who work at YPG
- * Other personnel who come to YPG for an authorized purpose (including personnel on official orders to YPG, DoD retirees/ID card holders, and delivery drivers)
