RESOLUTION NO. 2022-09

A JOINT RESOLUTION OF YUMA COUNTY (COUNTY) AND THE YUMA COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT, PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES DISTRICT, JAIL DISTRICT, FREE LIBRARY DISTRICT, IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS & SPECIAL DISTRICTS ADOPTING THE COUNTY BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023.

- WHEREAS: In accordance with the provisions of A.R.S. §§ 42-17101 et seq., and 48-3620, on May 16, 2022, an estimate was made of the amounts required to meet the public expenditures for the ensuing fiscal year (FY), and
- WHEREAS: Publication has been duly made, as required by A.R.S. § 42-17103, of said estimates, together with a notice that the Board of Supervisors (hereinafter "Board") will hold a public hearing for the purpose of hearing taxpayers at the designated time and place, and
- WHEREAS: In accordance with A.R.S. §42-17104, the Board met on June 20, 2022, at which meeting any taxpayer was privileged to appear and be heard in favor or against any of the proposed expenditures or tax levies, including concerns regarding the primary and secondary property tax levies, and
- WHEREAS: The sums to be raised by taxation, as specified in the estimates published in the manner described herein, do not in the aggregate amount exceed that amount as computed in A.R.S. § 42-17051, or in HB2876, and
- WHEREAS: The primary property tax levies set forth in the FY2022/23 budget can be achieved by maintaining the primary property tax rate of \$2.5082, and
- WHEREAS: The combined secondary tax levies set forth in the FY2022/23 budget can be achieved by reducing the FY2021/22 combined secondary property tax rates to \$1.0426, and
- WHEREAS: The assessments charged in a number of improvement districts are being changed from the FY2021/22 fiscal year in order to adequately cover improvement district FY2022/23 estimated expenditures and meet appropriate fund requirements,
- WHEREAS: Salary and benefit changes that go into effect in the 2022/23 fiscal year, subsequent to approval of a Resolution No. 2022-10.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD, AND THE BOARDS OF THE YUMA COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL, PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES, JAIL, FREE LIBRARY & IMPROVEMENT & SPECIAL DISTRICTS, as follows:

1. **Fiscal Year (FY) 2022/23 Budget:** The statement of Revenues and Expenditures prepared for FY2022/23, on the forms provided by the State Auditor General and presented to the Board on June 20, 2022, along with the textual and other changes to the FY2022/23 Recommended Budget required as a result of the Board's actions and other changes as listed on attachment, subsequent to the Recommended Budget's presentation, and hereby adopted as the FY2022/23 final budget.
2. **Capital Improvement Plan:** The Capital Improvement Plan for FY2022/23, along with textual, project, and other changes to the FY2022/23 Capital Improvement Plan as a result of the Board's actions subsequent to the Recommended Capital Improvement Plan is hereby adopted as the FY2022/23 Capital Improvement Plan.
